

- ✓ Newsletters, personal papers, government documents, and more, representing the burgeoning Gay Rights Movement

Part II (Human Sexuality) will focus on 18th Century to late 19th Century and publish Fall 2016

- ✓ history of erotic literature
- ✓ broader focus on sexuality
- ✓ “deviant” sexuality
- ✓ diaries of key figures

- The evolution of Civil Rights in the LGBTQ community
- AIDS activism, government policies, and anti-violence movements
- International selection of periodicals and newspapers representing Canada, Latin America, the Caribbean, Europe, Australia, New Zealand, Asia, Africa, and the Middle East
- Surveys, research, and homosexual reform in the second half of the 20th century
- Material documenting culture, the arts, and social scene
- Educational outreach efforts by major organizations
- Gay activism in modern Britain
